







RMs: Sample Questions

What is the return on investment for increasing BSNs? How can nurses develop and use data to inform policy change?

How does the primary care workforce need to be redesigned? What roles should nurses play? Does federal competition policy play a role in future scope of practice regulations for APRNs?



Scope of Practice

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Nurses should practice to full extent of their education and training

- Increased NP autonomy/use in primary care is associated w/ increased care access
- APRNs provide high quality patient care w/ outcomes similar to physicians

Nursing Education

Nurses should achieve higher levels of education and training through a system that promotes seamless academic progression

- Increased use of BSNs contributes to improved patient outcomes and reduced costs
- BSN prepared nurses have higher lifetime earnings

Partners in System Redesign

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Nurses should be full partners with physicians and others in redesigning U.S. health care

- Nurses play a central nurses in improving a range of patient outcomes within and across diverse settings
- Nurse-led interventions enhance health care value

Workforce Planning

Effective workforce planning and policy-making require better data collection w/information infrastructure

 Investments in robust, longitudinal workforce data systems are critical to achieve higher value health care

In 2005, the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation launched a program to generate, disseminate, and translate research that is designed to help the public understand how nurses contribute to and can improve patient care quality. The <u>Interdisciplinary Nursing Quality Research Initiative program</u> (INQRI) supported 48 interdisciplinary teams of researchers who conducted rigorous studies linking nursing to patient care processes and outcomes.
