

Minnesota Licensed APRN Growth



The graph above shows the increase in Minnesota licensed APRNs by role following revisions in authority to practice as an APRN which went into effect on January 1, 2015.

Prior to January 1, 2015, practice as an APRN required an RN license and a current copy of certification as an APRN on file with the Board which placed the individuals name on the MN APRN Registry. The law removed the requirement of a collaborative practice and written prescribing and now requires an APRN license. The Board of Nursing began accepting licensure applications in October of 2014.
